Thanks to the generous support of our friends and the greater Atlanta community, Camp Twin Lakes continues to grow and serve more campers each year. This summer was the largest on record with more than 1,900 campers with serious illnesses and life challenges passing through the gates of our Rutledge, GA facility. Camp Twin Lakes welcomed campers from two new Partners – Camp to Belong, a camp reuniting siblings who are placed in separate foster and adoptive homes, and Spina Bifida Camp – along with 17 returning Camp Partners. In addition, the new Camp to Go program further expanded our reach by bringing camp to children in hospital settings.

Summer 2008 was action-packed! Not only were we able to increase the number of campers we served, but we enhanced the quality of our camp experience by adding new programs and providing additional support to our Partner camps. The new radio station, 90.3 WCTL – The Kite, let the campers show off their talents. Campers DJ'ed, recorded songs, and conducted interviews, which were broadcast throughout common areas of Camp. Camp Twin Lakes added a "Pamper Pole" to its adventure program. Thrill-seeking campers climbed atop a 25-foot pole then leaped toward a nearby trapeze. Camp Twin Lakes' summer staff was more integrated with our Partners than ever before. In addition to running their usual program areas, members of the staff "adopted" cabins, spending meals and free time getting to know the campers.

Though school is back in session and our summer staff has returned to their homes and colleges, Camp Twin Lakes continues to reach children and adults through our fall weekend programs. As we near the end of 2008, Camp Twin Lakes thanks you for your support. Whether you have made a donation, volunteered at a fundraiser or at Camp, purchased a Partners Card or attended one of our special events, Camp Twin Lakes is glad to have you as a member of our family.

At first she said "no" but they encouraged her and rolled her chair over, gave her a big drum and asked her to start the beat. Her eyes were as wide as saucers as she started pounding on the drum. No one pitied her or looked at her with those questioning eyes you get when she is out in her chair. Everyone was in a chair! No one felt sorry for her. Nothing was inaccessible. and participate in. Faith felt so welcomed and encouraged... so capable. Can you imagine that feeling for her? I now understand why these kids say this is their favorite week of the year. They were all having a ball."

Shawn Saulsbury

Eleventh grader Shawn Saulsbury spends his free time hanging out with friends, going to the mall, playing basketball and enjoying the freedom that comes with a driver's license. Unlike many children with Sickle Cell Disease, Shawn's condition doesn't affect his every day life – not like it used to when he was younger.

"When I was younger, the doctors didn't want me to do too many things since we didn't know what would trigger a Sickle Cell crisis," says Shawn. "When it happened, I was in so much pain. I was in the hospital for weeks. It was awful. My mom had to miss work and see me in such pain."

Shawn was just 8 years old when he first attended Camp New Hope, a camp for children with Sickle Cell Disease, at Camp Twin Lakes. He admits that he was scared his first year and was apprehensive to try anything that first day. Once he got over his initial fear, he began making friends and having fun. By the end of camp, he didn't want to leave.

Now Camp is a comfortable place for Shawn. At Camp, he doesn't have to explain his condition to any one and he can be himself.

"At Camp New Hope, everyone has Sickle Cell. At school, people ask me why my eyes are yellow. When I go to camp, people will say 'my eyes were yellow yesterday.' Everybody has the same thing. We've all been through the same things."

Shawn's favorite activity at Camp is the high ropes course. "It's the most fun experience that anyone 13 and older could ever have!" says Shawn. "I was scared of heights before I did it. Last summer I was so proud of myself for doing all the obstacles on the course."

Shawn looks forward to many more summer at Camp Twin Lakes. He plans to return to Camp New Hope as a C.I.T. (Counselor in Training).

Camp Twin Lakes Launches Camp To Go



This summer, the new Camp To Go program brought the Camp Twin Lakes experience to children in area hospitals. Camp To Go was held at Children's Healthcare of Atlanta - Hughes Spalding from June 2-6, 2008, and at Medical College of

Georgia's Children's Medical Center in Augusta from August 25-28, 2008.

Camp To Go takes a five-day summer camp program and brings it to the hospital setting, where patients-turned-campers enjoy quintessential camp favorites like arts and crafts, fishing and campfires complete with songs, dancing and s'mores.

Transforming an area at each hospital with a camp-themed theatrical set of trees, cabins, campfires and wild life, the Camp to Go staff and volunteers aim to create as authentic an experience as possible. Each day of the program focused on a specific theme such as music, sports or nature with various activities scheduled throughout the day. Activities take place in playrooms, in common areas and at the patients' bedsides, allowing children who are unable to leave their beds the opportunity to join in the fun.

Pending funding, Camp Twin Lakes plans to expand the program next year, offering programs at all three Children's Healthcare of Atlanta hospitals and again at the Medical College of Georgia's Children's Hospital.
